<u>RECEIVING THE HOLY EUCHARIST</u> – those who believe in the true presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist are invited to partake of this Holy Sacrament. It is the practice of the PNCC to distribute the Holy Eucharist through the method of intinction. The Body and Blood of Christ are placed on the tongue, not in the hand.

POLISH HERITAGE DAY REMINDERS

In the year 966 A.D., the Polish leader named Mieszko was converted to Christianity, and accepted the Christian faith for the Polish people, who were made up of a number of different tribes. The first capital of Poland was Gniezno. The capital later moved to Kraków, and from here to Warsaw (Warszawa). In 1264, the Statute of Kalisz granted equal rights to Jews. When every other country in Europe expelled the Jews, Poland welcomed them. After the Protestant Reformation, many countries tortured and persecuted Protestants, but in Poland they were free to practice their religion. Poland had the first public library system in the modern world, and the first Department of Education. Poland also had the first written cinstitution in all of Europe. This fact is still observed every May 3rd as Polish Constitution Day. In the late 1700's, Poland began to grow weak because the nobility tried to run the country and the king. Poland's neighbors (Russia, Austria-Hungary and Prussia) took advantage of its weakness and began to completely wiped Poland off the map. In 1914, the WWI began, and by the time it was over, Germany was defeated, the Austria-Hungarian Empire was smashed and Russia was involved in its own revolution against the Czar. In 1918 Poland was resurrected after over 100 years. In **1939**, the **WWII** began when Nazi Germany invaded Poland unexpectadly. When the war was nearly over, the US, Russia and England made a pact dividing up who would control each portion of Europe. Poland was under communist rule, enforced by the Soviets. In **1978**, the election of the first Polish Pope in the history, the establishment of the Solidarity Union in Poland as well the support of the West...especially by President Ronald Reagan led to the establishment of the democratic Poland with Lech Wałesa becoming its first democratically-elected president. The first known Polish settlers in the New World came to Jamestown, Virginia in 1608, where they set up the first factory in the New World.
