

**RECEIVING THE HOLY EUCHARIST** – those who believe in the true presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist are invited to partake of this Holy Sacrament. It is the practice of the PNCC to distribute the Holy Eucharist through the method of intinction. The Body and Blood of Christ are placed on the tongue, not in the hand.


**EASTER** – It was in 1582 that Pope Gregory XIII of Rome completed a reconstruction of the Julian calendar produced new Easter tables. One major difference between the Julian calendar and the Gregorian calendar is the leap year rule. The universal adoption of the Gregorian calendar occurred slowly, however the Easter Churches (Orthodox) still determine the Easter dates using the older Julian calendar method. That is why there are different times that Easter is celebrated by various churches. The usual statement, that Easter Day is the first Sunday after the full moon that occurs next after the vernal equinox, is not a precise statement of the actual ecclesiastical rules. The full moon involved is not the astronomical full moon, but an ecclesiastical moon (determined from tables) that keeps, more or less, in step with the astronomical moon. The ecclesiastical rule are:

1. Easter falls on the first Sunday following the first ecclesiastical full moon that occurs on or after the day of the vernal

equinox;

- 2. This particular ecclesiastical full moon is the 14<sup>th</sup> day of a tabular lunation (new moon); and
- 3. The vernal equinox is fixed as March 21.

These rules result in the fact that Easter can never occur before March 22 or later than April 25 for the western Christians (Roman Catholic and Protestant Churches). These are the Gregorian dates for the ecclesiastical full moon that come from Gregorian tables. The day for Easter next year is: 2015 – April 5; *(from God's Field, January 29, 2008)*.
