

MONDAY, February 2nd – Solemnity – Presentation of the Lord – Blessing of Candles

This feast was first observed in the Eastern Church as "The Encounter". In the sixth century it began to be observed in the West: in Rome with a more penitential character and in France with solemn blessings and processions of candles. It is popularly known as "Candlemass". The Presentation of the Lord formally concludes the celebration of the Nativity; with the offerings of the Virgin Mother and the prophecy of Simeon, the events now point toward Easter.

2015/2016 - Upcoming First Holy Communion and Confirmation Classes – Parents and guardians <u>must</u> bring their children to the church for Sunday Mass – at least 1 year before the class begins. <u>It does apply to children who presently don't come to the church at all or once/twice a year</u>. Holy Communion is to receiving the Body and Blood of Christ, not cookies or a bar of chocolate – so children **must** be familiar with church services.

<u>CONFESSIONS FOR THE YOUTH</u>: Our younger members as well as their parents are reminded that Confession is an essential part of a child's religious upbringing. Remember this important part of their religious life. Confession is held on the **first Sunday** of every month at **9:45AM** (before Mass). Children before Confirmation age <u>must come</u> to **private** Confession. <u>If children (until Confirmation) would like to receive</u> <u>the Holy Communion in a worthy manner they must come and be well prepared for private confession at</u> <u>least once a month.</u> If other times are necessary please contact Fr. Robert. *Remember* that penance during the Confession MUST BE FULFILLED, if not – the Sacrament is not VALID.

<u>ATTENTION PARISHIONERS</u> – in case of your inability to come to church on any particular Sunday, please mail or submit your Sunday offerings and donations to our parish. Your church needs your financial support in order to pay utilities and expenses.

It is the practice of the PNCC to distribute the Holy Eucharist through the method of intinction. The Body and Blood of Christ are placed on the tongue, not in the hand.
