Sacrament of Matrimony – Arrangements should be made at least six months in advance.

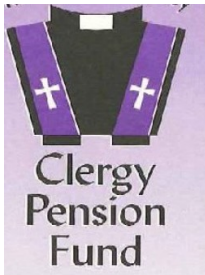
Emergencies, Sickness and deaths – please contact to the rectory immediately.

JUNE IS SACRED VOCATIONS MONTH – “Each year during the month of June, the PNCC observes Sacred Vocations month. During this month, the Church reminds all of her faithful of the urgent need to pray for the gift of vocations to the Holy Orders. The Church asks all of us to offer special prayers to bless our Church with new vocations. (...) The purpose of this month of Sacred Vocations is to petition God, the Author of every vocation to bless our Church with new priests and deacons who are blessed with strong faith, broad vision and solid academic background. **PLEASE, PRAY FOR AN INCREASE VOCATIONS TO THE HOLY PRIESTHOOD.**” (from “*Teachers Manual – Feasts, Solemnities and observances of the PNCC Customs and Traditions, Scranton, PA 2003*)

FROM THE CATECHISM of the PNCC – The **Third** Commandment of God: **“Remember To Keep Holy The Sabbath Day”**.

“The Third Commandment requires of us to keep holy the Lord’s Day. We observe Sunday as the Lord’s Day because our Lord Jesus Christ arose from the dead on that day and on Sunday the Holy Ghost descended upon the disciples. We should celebrate Sundays and Holy Days of obligation by: a) dedicating them to God; b) attending Mass; c) listening to the Word of God; d) prayer and the receiving of Holy Communion; e) special acts of charity. The Third Commandment forbids all unnecessary servile work and whatever else that prevents us from observing the Lord’s Day properly.”
