PHARISEES AND TAX COLLECTORS

Jesus strongly condemned religious hypocrisy. He illustrates this with a story that has lost much of its impact over the centuries. In the first century tax collectors were not merely civil servants, they were mercenaries who actually bid for the right to extort from their fellow Jews. Jesus turned the tables by showing that the supposed "sinner" had more humility than the self-proclaimed "holy man."
