Pastor's Report - 2014 - Rev. Robert Plichta

The last Annual Parish Meeting was held on Sunday, February 2, 2014.

- I started visiting our Parishioners while blessing their homes after the Epiphany of the Lord (January 6, 2014). I visited 27 (twenty-seven) families; [2013 – 25 families]. Thank you very much for your offerings.
- No baptism and weddings.
- 11 people officially joined the parish last year.
- First Holy Communion Classes (2 students) and Confirmation Classes (2 students) are in progress.
- Funerals (6): Sophia Stetts Funeral Mass on Jan. 23; James Dean (non-parishioner) Funeral service April 28; Sue Pascavage Funeral on April 29 (buried at our cemetery); Cecelia Zomczyk Funeral on April 23 (buried at the Holy Ghost Cemetery); David Halaburda Funeral on May 5 (buried at our cemetery); Joseph Makauskas Funeral on August 22 (buried at our cemetery). Since November 2003 till December 31, 2014 our Parish had fifty (50) funerals [parishioners and friends]. In the Holy Ghost Congregation we lost 28 members in 11 years.
- For first two months I celebrated the Holy Mass every Sunday at 8:45 AM. Then, after closing the Holy Ghost parish we had 2 Masses at 9:00 and 11:00 AM; but in March we went back to one Holy Mass at 10:00AM. We had the Holy Mass as often as is possible during the week mostly at 8:30AM or 6:00PM. These liturgical celebrations takes place in an empty church. During the holy days of obligation I celebrated the Holy Masses according to the Liturgical calendar of the PNCC.
- The Sick Parishioners were visited mostly on the first Thursday of each month. There were 100 (one hundred) shut-ins from our Parish visited. They received

Sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion at their homes, hospital or at nursing homes.

<u>The Lenten season</u> began on Ash Wednesday, March 5. Holy Mass with distribution of ashes took place in our church at 10:00AM (9 attended) and 7:30PM (14 attended). Ashes were also distributed at 12:00Noon (12 attended) and 4:00PM (8 attended).

During the Season of Lent I celebrated the <u>Stations of the Cross</u> (Fridays at 6:00PM) and the <u>Bitter Lamentations</u> (Wednesdays at 6:00PM). Frackville Community Lenten Ecumenical service was held in our church on Wednesday, March 19 (55 people participated).

- The liturgy of the <u>Holy Week</u>: Palm Sunday 10:00 AM (48 people attended) (2012 20); Holy Thursday 6:00 PM (12 people attended) (2013 3); Good Friday 12:00 Noon (19 people attended) (2013 7); Holy Saturday 3:00 PM (16 people attended) (2012 14).
- Solemnity <u>Resurrection of our Lord</u> we celebrated the Holy Mass and Easter procession at 7:00 AM on April 20 (21 people attended); the second Easter Mass was at 10:00AM (36 participants).
- <u>Plymouth Seniorate Council</u> meeting took place in our church on Saturday, June 14 at 1:00PM in Hazleton, PA. We elected three delegates for this meeting, and it happened first time in 10 years that no one attended the meeting (!)
- <u>Corpus Christi</u> service for our Plymouth Seniorate was held in our church on Thursday, June 19 in McAdoo, PA, at 7:00 PM. Mr. James Abicunas, Ms. Elizabeth Greenman and my family participated. Thank you.
- <u>Memorial Day</u> service was celebrated on Monday, May 26 at 10:00AM with five people participated at our cemetery; the Prayer Service was also held at the Holy Ghost Cemetery at 12:00 with 4 participants.
- <u>All Souls</u> service we celebrated on Sunday, November 2, immediately after the Holy Mass, in the church.

• Veterans Day celebration took place on Sunday, Nov. 9 with 25 people participated.

St. John the Baptist parish has one lector last year – Mr. James Abicunas. In few Sundays Mr. Jacob Komara was the second one, but in May he disappeared. Veronica Plichta, Joe Karvois and Dylan Whitecavage help at the altar.

I am a member of the Diocesan Council of the Central Diocese and a member of the Matrimony Commission in the Central Diocese. I do some work for the Central Diocese once a week.

 <u>Advent and Christmas 2014</u>. Every week (*Wednesday's*) during the season of Advent, I celebrated *Rorate* Mass in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary at 6:30 AM. <u>Nobody participated</u>.

<u>Holy Mass of the Shepherds</u> I celebrated on **December 24**, at 10:00 PM. (37) – thirty seven people attended the Mass (2013 - 48).

<u>Christmas Day</u> Mass we celebrated at 11:00AM, and (5) five people at the service -(2013 - 2).

- The principal feast days and PNCC feast days were observed, as required.
- In the year 2014 we had 232 services in the church: 1783 people attended, and 1429 received the Holy Communion; [2013: 278 1795 1340].
- The monthly parish newsletter started to be printed and sent to our Parishioners and Friends in March (each first Sunday of the month).

The church remains empty all the time.

• Holy Ghost/St. John the Baptist merging:

January 31, 2014 at 2:00PM a special meeting with Bishop Bernard Nowicki was held in St. John's hall for Parishioners of our congregation. Important matters regarding merging situation were discussed.

The last Holy Mass was celebrated in Holy Ghost church on Sunday, February 2 at 9:30AM. Then our Diocesan Bishop – The Rt. Rev. Bernard Nowicki deconsecrated the church on Tuesday, February 4 at 11:00AM.

The next day cleaning process began in the church. The altars were donated to the Guardian Angel Parish in Los Angeles, CA, and some other items as well.

St. John the Baptist received the Sanctuary Light, sanctuary chairs, pew books, candles, chasubles and some other liturgical items. Thank you very much!

Mr. Joseph Petrusky installed the Sanctuary Light in the church. Thank you. Presently we are waiting to have a person who can take care of the Holy Ghost Cemetery. Any volunteers?

Membership – we are not a huge congregation, and we count on every single member. However, I have noticed that we have at least 26 people who are paying members <u>only</u> and they don't participate in the parish activities (worship God and help in fundraisers) <u>at all</u>. Why?

- Children Items Chinese Auction was held on Saturday, May 31 at 5:00PM.

- Christmas Party was held on Sunday, December 14 in the hall after the 1:00PM Mass.
