

HOLY THURSDAY, April 18th – Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper

The Mass of the Last Supper begins our three days of enacting the Easter mystery. In this rich celebration, we recall tonight the Passover meal that commemorates the liberation of Israel from Egypt, the institution of the Eucharist, and Jesus washing of the disciples' feet.

GOOD FRIDAY, April 19th - The Lord's Passion

According to the Church's ancient tradition, the sacraments are not celebrated today or tomorrow. The celebration of the Lord's passion takes place in the afternoon. The celebration consists of three parts: liturgy of the word, veneration of the cross, and Holy Communion. Fasting: all those of post-confirmation age are to fast TODAY limiting themselves to one full meal and two smaller meals, with no snacking between meals. These regulations are recommended for healthy adults. Children under First Holy Communion age, the infirm, those on restrictive medication and the elderly are exempt from the obligation of fasting.

$12:00 \ (at\ Noon)$ – The Liturgy of the Good Friday with adoration of the Cross and Holy Communion

Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament will be held until 8:00PM.

7:00PM – Stations of the Cross

HOLY SATURDAY, April 20th

On this day the Church waits at the Lord's tomb, meditating on his suffering and death. The altar is left bare, and the Holy Mass is not celebrated. Today's service is arranged in: a) a brief service of light; b) the liturgy of the word; c) blessing of water.

2:00PM – The Liturgy of the Blessing of Fire, Water and Paschal Candle

- △ After the Liturgy blessing of Easter food (baskets)
- Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament till 8:00PM.

NEXT SUNDAY, April 21st - RESURRECTION OF OUR LORD

7:30AM – Easter procession. After Procession – Holy Mass – intention: for All Parishioners.

Develop and emphasize Discipleship through 2019: Our purpose is to strengthen all members in their following of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Getting back to basics. Discipleship is who we are – all this flows from being a disciple of Jesus.

May — The Disciple: Living the example of our Blessed Mother — Saying "Yes" to God. <u>Projected outcome</u>: Church members will be inspired to say "Yes" to God by a choice they make each week during this month choosing God's Will for them and not their own.

<u>DUES 2019.</u> Since January 2005, each adult member (18 years old+) is now be recorded as an individual unit. This means every adult member is now responsible for his/her own dues. To continue to be a member at St. John the Baptist parish and a member of the Polish National Catholic Church each adult will be responsible for paying the following:

Total dues for 2019 per Adult Member: \$137.00 Per Year

The parish itself has an obligation to pay dues according to the number of active members to the General Church and Diocese and our financial administration distributes these monies also as directed by the General Synod. A breakdown of where these dollars are sent is available upon request.
