The course is two years, as required by the Church and will be completed in Spring of the year 2022. We have PERPETUAL GRASS CUTTING! ALSO, a new grave will be leveled off and grass seed will be put on it. Other than that, it is the responsibility of the loved ones to maintain the individual lots. If you have someone buried there and the condition

of the lot doesn't meet your approval please fix it or hire someone to fix it. We will be trying to get the trees all around the perimeter of the cemetery trimmed since they are beginning to hang over the road and the gates need to be painted since they are beginning to rust. Very few cemetery donations come into the cemetery fund so our funds are limited but we are trying to do the best we can. Thank you for your help with these matters!
