I Reading: Acts 10:25-26. 34-35. 44-48

II Reading: I John 4:7-10 GOSPEL: John 15:9-17

Jesus said to His disciples: 'As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in His love. I have told you this so that my own joy may be in you and your joy be complete. This is My commandment: love one another, as I have loved you. PNCC 2021 Future Direction Plan Committee – Action plan for PNCC parishes based on the efforts of the 24th and 25th General Synods. MAY - BISHOP JOSEPH PADEWSKI, Martyr

Reflection and Action Item: Bishop Joseph Padewski was made Bishop in 1935. The growth of the PNCC diocese of Poland was abruptly halted with the Nazi invasion of Poland, which began World War II. Fully ¾ of the diocese was destroyed. Padewski himself imprisoned and tortured. He was later released as an American prisoner of war, for a German general officer. He was sent back to America where he once again assumed the role of a parish pastor. Following WWII, Bishop Padewski returned to Poland and worked to rebuilt our diocese in Poland. He gained the church a legal status in 1946. Later, in the midst of his efforts, the communist government made a general persecution of the Christian Church. The oral account of his death was given church authorities by a cleaning woman who witnessed the torture Bishop Padewski endured. He died on May 10, 1951. At the age of 57, he became the first bishop-martyr of the PNCC. He was buried in Warsaw, Poland.
